

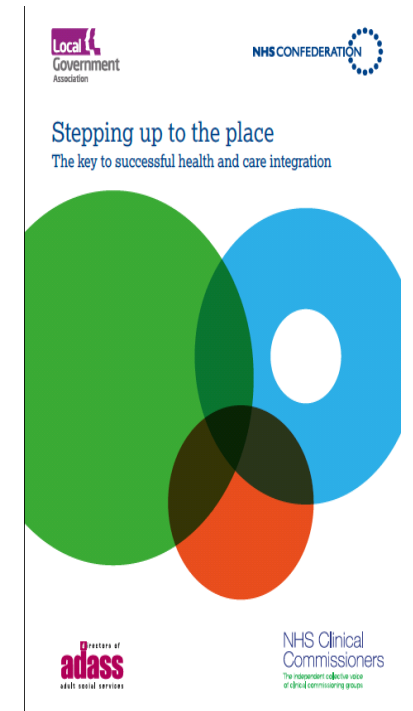
Integrating with social care and public health

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Stepping Up To The Place

- Shared, system-wide vision for integrated health and care
- Key characteristics:
 - **Shared commitment:** a focus on outcomes, developing person-centred, holistic services and investing in prevention and ways to empower people to take control of their own health and wellbeing
 - **Shared leadership:** place-based leadership behaviours and inclusive governance arrangements, backed by a clear, shared vision and integrated activity
 - **Shared systems:** finances, care model, workforce, data and IT, estates
